"We will have things to occupy children, and at the same time, parents can listen to speakers that educate and entertain," said event organizer Thasia Anne Lunger, a local author, poet and retired social worker.

There will be a free raffle with prizes including useful

items like laundry detergent, dish soap, toilet paper, paper towels, diapers and wipes.

"We are blessed with agencies and people in our community that make it their mission to help others going through hard times people just don't always know where to find them," Thasia Anne said. "This event is aimed to bring compassionate individuals and organizations together to share how they can help others get through tough financial, health, relationship and job situations."

A new kind of worship is coming to Messiah in September as Pastor Tom launches Bubble Church, a service geared for children and young families.


Pastor Tom is introducing the new worship service to encourage more young families to come to church. Part of our mission as a church is to make disciples. We want to connect with those who have shown an interest in what church is about.

Bubble Church is worship geared for families with children. The worship follows the pattern of a traditional church service with some elements

lifelong Lutherans would recognize. For example, we begin by saying sorry (confession), then offer thanks to God with children sharing what they are thankful for (intercessions). A Bible story will be told using puppets

or skits (the Word), using the same form of words to say goodbye to each other (the blessing).

Pastor Tom knows that there a lot of young families in our area. As evident by Our Back to School Bash. There are many families in the community who are willing to come to our church when there is something that meets their needs. It seems people are interested in the church and want to have a connection with Messiah, this can be a way to do that. Pastor Tom believes Bubble Church will be a real blessing for us as a congregation and a community of believers.

We continue to make the vision which the congregation adopted a reality.


- The Worship Team continues to explore the options regarding the placement of the screens, which screens work best, and the installation that accompanies those screens.
- The worship listening devices are installed! Anyone can use the listening units that accompany the base either using the ear piece provided, or bring your own

headphones. This will be of great help for those who have any hearing difficulties.

- The children's ministry is coming into shape with the Children, Youth and Family Ministry Teams.
- The Bubble Church implementation is in the embryonic stage but will be ready for Fall 2025.
- The School Day Off Day Camp is still on course for the first camp day in October on Indigenous/ Columbus Day.

There are other aspects of our vision, but those are not expected to be implemented until next calendar year. Therefore, we do not have updates yet.

We ask that you continue to keep our congregation in your prayers as we explore new and exciting ways to do ministry in our ever changing, fluid, dynamic world.

You know there are other people far worse off than you are, but sometimes you just don't feel that way.

You don't feel good. Money is tight. Time goes too fast. You hurt. You have health issues. Your allergies are acting up. You have legal troubles, or the obituaries hit too close to home. Someone has to do things for you that you used to do. Sometimes it's hard to breathe. Your partner is grouchy and so are you. Does that cover most of it? Add a few, toss a few. I hear you.

Faith is hard sometimes. We pray for patience...and then learn how much we have. We pray for strength and endurance, yet we feel like crawling into a hole to sleep it

off. I hear you.

If I hear you, you know that our Triune God hears you. He knows exactly how you suffer and how you feel about the smallest thing.

Sometimes He wants you to wait and work your way through.

Sometimes He has things He wants you to do for yourself or for someone else. Sometimes His answer is NO. It is not ours to question why.

Look and listen to the signs around you, be it a book or a quote or nature. Open the Bible randomly. It will give you guidance. Keep your faith intact, no matter the circumstances, no matter how difficult. If you are able to go to church, that's wonderful! If you are not, that can be wonderful too, as

long as you use the time to feed your faith instead of relinquishing it.

All of these things you already know in your heart, for you are a faith-filled servant of our Lord.

Sometimes you and I have to be reminded that religion is based a great deal on faith and obedience.

Prayer builds them both.

Sometimes it is a formal prayer.

Sometimes it is as simple as "help me." He hears you.

May your faith in our Triune God stay with you eternally. May He give you His blessings, and may you recognize them with thanksgiving.




