



From the desk of Pr. Tom

Obliviously into Lent

The Christian faith baffles me. It seems to me that everything the faith requires of me is contradictory! We are asked to turn the other cheek. We are to forgive seventy times seventy times. We are to be a people who pray for our enemies even while they seek our destruction.

Even the celebration of Christmas was moved from a summer activity to the week around the winter solstice, just so we can go against the pagan winter celebration, Saturnalia. So, it is no surprise that in the midst of rebirth, renewed warmth and the subsiding of death and new baseball seasons, we celebrate a very humbling season that we call Lent.

While the people around us are celebrating the start of Spring Training and soon, March Madness in sports, Lowe's is packed with gardeners looking to restart their gardens, and school children are counting down the days to Spring Break, we are asked to go the opposite direction and contemplate our relationship with Christ. For many, this isn't fun! To sit quietly with our Lord requires a lot from us. For many, sitting with God means having to account for every single one of our mistakes and foibles from the past year. In other words, we have to look at our stark humanity.

I remember one autumn day while I was in seminary, I was walking around Lake Harriet in Minneapolis with my mother. It was Yom Kippur, and we saw a few different Jewish men, each sitting alone on various park benches in deep and serious contemplation and prayer. I asked my mother what that was all about, and she explained that Yom Kippur for Jewish folks is the one day version of our forty - day Lenten season.

I looked at those men, and they were oblivious to the world walking around them and taking turn lipping and singing their psalms and prayers while their eyes scanned the pages of their Torah. It was quite something to see.

I have always felt Lent to be something like that. While we hear and even see all the rebirth and renewed life springing all around us, we need to sit back and become oblivious to the world so that we can completely focus on God and His will for us.

But why? Why couldn't we do that in the bleak midwinter? God invites us to do this all the time, but to me, it doesn't matter when Lent occurs; we will always have reasons to be distracted from completely focusing on God. So, in the end, for me, why not now? By taking the time to be with God while the earth around us is renewing itself, is a fitting time for me to renew my relationship with God. Through a series of intense prayers and intimate conversations with God, I can come to the foot of Jesus hanging on the cross with all my humanity and walk through that Good Friday renewed for a resurrection on Easter.

Lent allows me to die of my old self so that I can experience my own resurrection while I gratefully celebrate Christ's resurrection. Lent allows me to be crucified with Christ and I no longer live, but through my prayers and intimate time I spend with Christ, I invite Him to live in me.

Lent allows me to die and to be reborn with Christ in me. What does Lent mean to you?

SERMON SERIES

Lenten Sermon Series Covenant

Covenant isn't some mystical word. It is a subject few Christians understand, yet the word is used more than 300 times in the Bible. Understanding your covenant with God the Father and Jesus Christ your Savior is crucial.

Covenant is about knowing God, personally, intimately, and about being in a relationship with him. Nothing is more central to the Christian relationship with God than the covenant we make with Jesus at baptism and renew every week when we partake of the bread and wine. In this covenant, we actually carry His name - we are family, with all the rights, privileges, and obligations of a family member.

This sermon series delves into God's covenant to His people and His promises and how He fulfilled parts of those promises through the exile and restoration of Judah. God forged His covenant with Israel, and His people rebelled against Him. The way God chastised Israel in exile and then rescued and restored them to their land, points toward the ultimate redemption He fulfilled in the death and resurrection of Christ. A bonus in this series is gaining a clear picture of what the New Covenant actually is.



Strive for Balance in the New Year

When we visited Nova Scotia a few years ago, my husband and I discovered a small hidden beach on Cape Breton Island filled with hundreds of cairns human-made piles of balanced rocks. Whether done as a memorial, a form of meditation, or to mark a trail, creating a cairn takes patience.

Since returning from that trip, my husband has strategically placed several cairns around our front yard, serving as a reminder to the unique sight we experienced, and symbolizing the beauty of a life in balance. They serve as my cue card when I start to feel off-kilter, which tends to happen when I've given too much time to my business, volunteer involvements, and social engagements, and not enough time to activities that help me feel stable and grounded. Cooking nutritious meals, exercising on most days, getting a good night's sleep, attending weekly religious services, and spending quality time with family and friends helps me keep my life in balance. Yes, I manage for short periods with these priorities on the back burner, but when it goes on too long, I get irritable and anxious. Like me, the cairns in our front yard lose their balance sometimes too when the wind or deer knocks off a stone or two. Then, after noticing the damage, my husband or I head outside to restack them, putting them in balance once again.

Reflection: What symbolizes a life in balance for you? What symptoms are reminders that your life is off-kilter, and what practices bring back a sense of balance and stability? How do you incorporate these during your work as a caregiver?


