Vacation and Rest: A Holy Pause

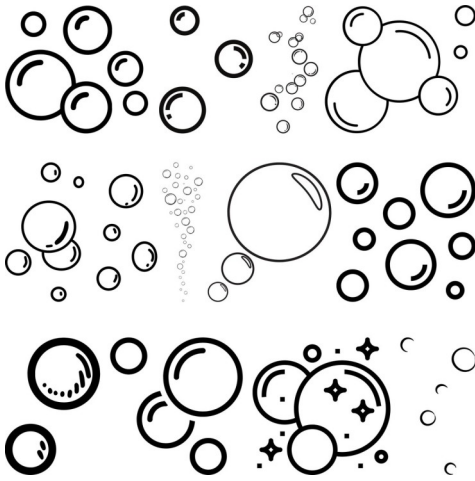

BUBBLE CHURCH IS COMING SOONER THAN YOU THINK!



It has been a vision of Pastor Tom to experiment and find ways to increase the spirituality of worship and attendance. Pastor Tom said when he was called to be the Pastor at Messiah, he was going to focus on two priorities in the early years of his tenure: explore increasing the spirituality and attendance of worship and find ways to grow the Children, Youth and Family Ministry at Messiah. Since the passage of the vision plan, the Worship Committee and the Children, Youth and Family Ministry (CYFM) in partnership with Pastor Tom are launching Bubble Church.

Bubble Church follows the pattern of a traditional church service with some elements people would recognize: begin by saying sorry (confession), go on to offer thanks to God, children share what they are thankful for (intercessions). A Bible story is told using various tools (the Word), and they use the same form of words to say goodbye to each other (the blessing).

Part of Messiah's mission as a church is to make disciples. Bubble Church is for young families, but it is worship. We want to connect with those who have shown an interest in what church is about. We have a lot of young families in the area. Our Back to School Bash event is well attended each year, which indicates that there are a lot of families in our backyard. Pastor Tom believes people want to have a connection with a church, and this is a way Messiah can invite them to do so here. It will be a real blessing for Messiah to have them exploring their spirituality here.

We plan to launch Bubble Church in September, but we are having a trial run on **Sunday, June 22, 9:45 am until approximately 10:15 am. We encourage you to bring your young children to this experience.** You can expect songs, skit, coffee, donuts, and a quick lesson from Pastor Tom.

We ask that you come with an open mind, a spirit of participation, and a willingness to engage all the young people as we move forward.



VISION IMPLEMENTATION UPDATE



We continue to make the vision which the congregation adopted a reality.

- The Worship Team continues to explore the options regarding the placement of the screens, which screens work best, and the installation that accompanies those screens.
- The worship listening devices are installed! Anyone can use the listening units that accompany the base, either by using the earpiece provided, or bringing

your own headphones. This will be of great help for those who have any hearing difficulties.

- The children's ministry is coming into shape with the Children, Youth and Family Ministry Teams.
- The Bubble Church implementation is in the embryonic stage but will be ready for Fall 2025.
- The School Day Off Day Camp is still on course for the first camp day in October on Indigenous/ Columbus Day.

There are other aspects of our vision, but those are not expected to be implemented until next calendar year. Therefore, we do not have updates yet.

We ask that you continue to keep our congregation in your prayers as we explore new and exciting ways to do ministry in our ever - changing, fluid, dynamic world.

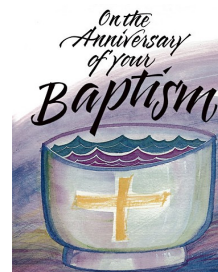

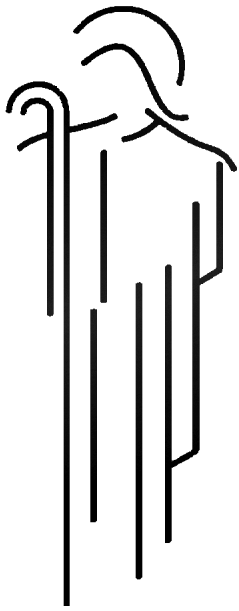
