

#### From the desk of Pr. Tom The Suspicions of Lent

On Valentine's Day, we began the solemn season of Lent. This season is meant to help us prepare for the death and resurrection of Christ.

In the summer of 2009, Rob Hill of Mars Hill Ministries, hosted Poets, Prophets, Preachers, a conference on reclaiming the art of the sermon. Peter Rollins, a presenter, led a discussion on "iconic" collective that offers experiments in transformance (transformative performance art). This kind of art, in part, offers a radical, postmodern forms of worship for those on the margins of faith and the church.

For our purpose, we consider one exercise that they did that can inform our Lenten observances. Peter Rollins called is "Atheism for Lent." Each year, they read a book influenced by, or about, the prominent writers who wrote suspiciously of faith and the Church. Feuerbach, Marx, Freud and Nietzsche. This practice, though radical, resonates with Cornelius Plantinga's idea in Not the Way It's Supposed to Be: A Breviary of Sin, "Before we seek to score points against the genetic fallacies and ad hominem arguments of modern atheists, before we 'turn suspicion again the suspicious,' perhaps we ought to adopt self-suspicion 'as the [practice] of Lent.' We ought to consider the possibility that in our own religion, 'what presents itself as an altruistic virtue may be, in terms of motive and function, only an egoistic vice dressed up in its Sunday-go-to-meetin' clothes." (p.111)

This quote from Plantinga may be a fruitful approach to Lent because our own religion can easily become an egoistic vice dressed up in Sunday-go-to-meeetin' clothes, and our own people, especially our neighbors know this. Pastors and church leaders are not unfamiliar with the critique that the church is full of hypocrites who act one way on Sunday mornings and another entirely the rest of the week. And truthfully, even the leaders of our church-maybe especially the leaders of our churches-are guilty of this. So Lent, the season for repentence, begins with a reminder of our profound sin and mortality (Ash Wednesday) and walks us all the way to a cross, if we are honest, we recognize as the place where we crucified the Son of God. It is not at all out of place, during this time, to listen to those suspicious of religion, and suspicious of the church, precisely in order to encourage and develop our own self-suspicion.

There are many ways to exercise self-suspicion during Lent. One is to recommit to the practice of confession. Allow yourself to be completely with God both during corporate confession on Sunday mornings but also in your private individual confession with God.

Allow this season of Lent to be a time where suspicion rules your life and let that's suspicion transform you into an even greater disciple for Christ on this earth dedicated to the poor, the lost and being the hands and feet of God.

#### Why don't we use Alleluias during Lent?

Because of the penitential character of the season of Lent, singing or saying the word "alleluia" has historically been suspended during Lent's forty days. This period of individual and congregational reflection on the quality of our baptismal faith and life suggests that the joyful nature of alleluia is more appropriately reserved for our Easter celebrations when it is given full and jubilant voice.

The omission of alleluia during Lent goes back at least to the fifth century in the western church. The custom of actually bidding it farewell, however, developed in the Middle Ages. The hymn "Alleluia, song of gladness" (*Evangelical Lutheran Worship* #318) contains a translation of an 11th century Latin text that compares an alleluia-less Lent to the exile of the Israelites in Babylon. The text then anticipates the joy of Easter when glad alleluias will return in all their heavenly splendor.

At First, we will "resurrect" the Alleluia on Easter morning but for congregations who celebrate the Easter Vigil on Holy Saturday night, they will burst out singing the Alleluia at the moment of the declaration of Christ's resurrection.

So instead of the Alleluia, we focus on the penitential nature of Lent and our respective humanity with Christ.



**Campers grow** through a day camp experience in which they immerse themselves in a different Bible story several times throughout each day.

**Staff gain confidence in their leadership** as they learn life skills such as time management, flexibility, and responsibility.

We build strong neighborhood ministries and nurture youth who are excited about their faith, bonded with each other, and eager to step into leadership.

**Camp Hope is a gift to parents** who are looking for an affordable, safe place for their children to spend time during the summer.

This year's theme is God's World. We will learn about five countries from five continents and learn how God works in all those countries and peoples.

The camp day will be from 8:30AM to 3:00PM and during the camp day, the campers will have age-appropriate bible study, games, music, arts and crafts and healthy lunches and snacks. On Tuesday and Thursday of the camp week, there will be Drench Days when they can play with water outside. This week promises to be a time of great fun, joyful play, edifying singing, meaningful new friends, and great learning about God's World.

The dates for Camp Messiah is July 8-12.

We are looking for high school youth to be a staff members and in April, we will have the registration forms available to sign up. If you have children younger than sixth grade, consider having them be campers in this new and exciting ministry.
